Saturday, 18th September, 2010 Schedule of Sections

Section 1: Vegetables and fruit

1. **One Cabbage, green** — *(any variety with approx 75 mm of stalk)*
2. **Three Courgettes** - *(Young, tender, shapely fruits, 100-200 mm in length, or if round varieties approx. 75 mm in dia. of any colour but well matched.)*
3. **Two Marrows** - *(less than 380 mm long or in the case of round cultivars less than 500 mm in circumference.)*
4. **Four Potatoes** - *all one variety (Medium-sized generally between 170 g and 225 g per tuber, clean, clear-skinned tubers; eyes few and shallow)*
5. **Six Runner Beans** - *(Long, slender, straight fresh pods of good colour with stalks and no outward sign of seeds)*
6. **Three Onions, over 250 g dressed** — *(Large firm, thin-necked bulbs, blemish-free and of good form. The bulbs should be well-ripened.)*
7. **Three Onions, 250 g or under dressed** — *(Firm, thin-necked blemish-free bulbs of good form which should be well-ripened.)*
8. **Two freshly pulled globe Beetroot, with foliage** — *(Spherical, of approx. 50 to 70 mm in diameter with a tap root, smooth skin and flesh of a uniform dark colour.)*
9. **Four Tomatoes, medium** — *(Fruits [approx. 65 mm in dia.], ripe but firm, and of good shape. Richly coloured fruits with fresh calyces attached.)*
10. **Four Tomatoes, small fruited** — *(Size not exceeding 35 mm in dia. Fresh, ripe but firm, well-coloured fruits, blemish-free, and with fresh calyces attached.)*
11. **Three Carrots, with trimmed foliage** — *(Fresh roots of good shape and colour. Skin clear and bright.)*
12. **Ugliest Vegetable.**
13. **Collection of six kinds of Vegetables in a basket** — *(judged for quality and overall arrangement).*
14. **Most unusual Vegetable** - *(Judged for quality and its unusual nature).*
15. **A jug of eight different Herbs** - *(Fresh, healthy, clean, blemish-free foliage.)*

16. **Six Raspberries** - *(Large, ripe fruits, of good colour, free from blemishes, in good condition and having stalks.)*
17. **Any other own choice Vegetable** - *two of same variety*
18. **Four dessert Apples** - *(Optimum-sized shapely fruits with eyes and stalks intact and clear unblemished skins.)*
19. **Four cooking Apples** - *(Large, shapely, solid fruits with undamaged eyes, stalks intact and clear unblemished skins.)*
20. **Own choice Fruit** - *four of same variety, or single bunch*

Section 2: Flowers

21. Vase of three Dahlias *(same type)*
22. Vase of mixed Dahlias *(maximum 7 blooms)*
23. Vase of mixed Sweet Peas
24. Up to 3 stems of any seasonal flower of a single variety *(excluding those species for which there are specific classes in this schedule)* — to be judged for flower quality
25. Single Rose (HT)
26. Single stem Floribunda Rose
27. Vase of mixed HT Roses *(maximum 5 stems)*
28. Vase of mixed Miniature Roses *(maximum 5 stems)*
29. Vase of mixed Floribunda and/or Shrub Roses *(maximum 5 stems)*
30. Vase of mixed Seasonal flowers **(OWN CONTAINER)**
31. Vase of mixed Annuals **(OWN CONTAINER)**

32. Garden on a plate
33. Piece of jewelry fashioned out of fruit and/or vegetables
34. An animal/s made from fruit/vegetable
